1. When a Commonwealth champion wins a World Championship, whether or not recognised by the Council or by an individual member of the Council, he shall automatically relinquish the Commonwealth Championship.
2. In view of varying medical standards and requirements for boxers throughout the Commonwealth, Promoters are urged to ensure that boxers from abroad competing for Commonwealth Titles are capable of meeting the standards of the host governing authorities.
3. It is the obligation of the Champion to meet the defence requirements determined by the Council.
